## Anniversary Service

In March we celebrated 9 years since the start of the Acts Community Church that we founded and pastor. Pastor David Sea District Superintendent of District 5 was there to minister. One young man received the Holy Ghost. He was one of the two leaders (delegates) of the chapel in the Men's Prison that abruptly left the service one Wednesday in 2012 when four men received the Holy Ghost during the worship. They were from a church that didn't believe in speaking in tongues. They both were released from prison and now attend our church. The one who received the Holy Ghost asked to be baptized in Jesus' name, as he had been "baptized" by an AOG pastor in prison. He was baptized the evening before we left Bolivia for deputation.



## Deputation

In April we had to say goodbye to our church and Bolivia in order to come back to North America for deputation. We are grateful for the opportunity to visit the pastors and churches who have supported us, and to share our burden and needs for the nation of Bolivia. ## Quillacollo

In January 2020 we planned on starting a daughter work in the nearby city of Quillacollo, the 2<sup>nd</sup> largest city in our state. In March we went into quarantine and couldn't have services until October. Believing that all our plans for 2020 were over, we had no idea that the new church plant was already in progress. A pastor who was born and raised in Quillacollo, as a young man moved to Argentina where he was converted and started pastoring a church. He came to Bolivia to visit his ailing father, who sadly passed away before he could say goodbye. Stuck in Bolivia from March until December, Pastor Ruben began to visit family and friends and was invited to minister at a church of 300. The pastor had died of Covid and the church needed someone to preach. Before leaving Bolivia to go home, Pastor Ruben asked us to pastor the work until he could move back to Bolivia. One of the new members owns a garage and has room for 60 people in his customer waiting area. We now have church rent-free in a city where several attempts have been made to start a church! An average of 45 adults attend service and many have expressed a desire to be baptized in Jesus' name!



## Childrens' Day

April 12 is Childrens' Day in Bolivia. Sister Dame and her team held a special service on Sunday April 11. We rejoiced to see an attendance of 107 in our church. Being the last Sunday that we would be there before going to the States for deputation, it was extra special.
